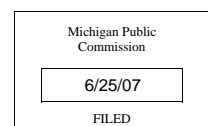

APPLICATION AND ARRANGEMENT OF TARIFF

APPLICATION

1. This Tariff applies to the Primary Basic Local Exchange Service of Lennon Telephone Company - hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company or the Company - in exchanges in Michigan as designated herein. (C)

2. Primary Basic Local Exchange Service is that of furnishing facilities for telephone intercommunication between customers within a Local Service Area. (C)
3. The provision of service is subject to regulations specified in the M.P.S.C. Tariffs of the Telephone Company, which tariffs as they now exist or as they may be revised, added to, or supplemented by superseding issues are hereby made a part of this Tariff.

PRIMARY BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE

A. General Exchange: Lennon Durand Area (C)

- 1. The provision of service at the rates shown below is subject to the regulations given in the General Rules and Regulations as they now exist and are filed with and form part of this Tariff.
- 2. The rates shown below entitle the customer to messages without other charge to all stations bearing the designation of a central office at the following exchanges, which comprise the Local Calling Area.

DURAND FLUSHING LENNON OWOSSO
FLINT GAINES NEW LOTHROP SWARTZ CREEK

Messages to the above exchanges will be treated as being within the Local Calling Area, and a customer will receive no other charge, if the provider terminating the call has made interconnection arrangements with Lennon Telephone Company.

B. PRIMARY BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE (PBLES)

Access Line Charge, Per Line, Per Month 26.94

PBLES is for residential use only. PBLES is for voice communication only.

For calls to the exchanges listed in A. above, the Company will charge the following:

First 100 outgoing calls in a month: 0.00 per call
Outgoing calls in excess of 100 in a month: 0.09 per call



The Company will measure conversation minutes from the time the Company's switching equipment receives answer supervision to the earlier of when the Company's switch receives disconnection supervision from its own switch or from the terminating switch. The Company will measure conversation minutes to the next higher whole minute per call. The Company will not bill the end user for non-conversation time related to local calls.

The Company will not provide call record detail in the end user's monthly bill. No minutes or calls are carried forward from month to month.

PBLES is a stand-alone service that does not include any unregulated features.

PBLES provides unlimited incoming local calls.

A customer desiring to subscribe to PBLES must notify the Company.

Primary Basic Local Exchange Service entitles customer to 12,000 outgoing minutes per month in local calling. Charges for calls in excess of 12,000 are set forth in C., below.

B. PRIMARY BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE (PBLES) (Cont'd)

A person with disabilities or who is voluntarily providing a service for an organization classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) or (19) organization, or a person who provides a service for a congressionally chartered veterans organization or their duly authorized foundations, is exempt from the 100 calls per month limitation.

Only one Primary Basic Local Exchange Service will be provided to an address.

Calls made to a telephone number with an NPA NXX that is associated with the rate center that is within the customer's local calling area are local calls regardless of the physical location of the called party.

Outgoing conversation minutes in excess of 12,000 in a month: \$0.05 per minute

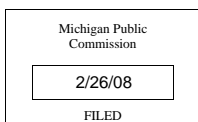

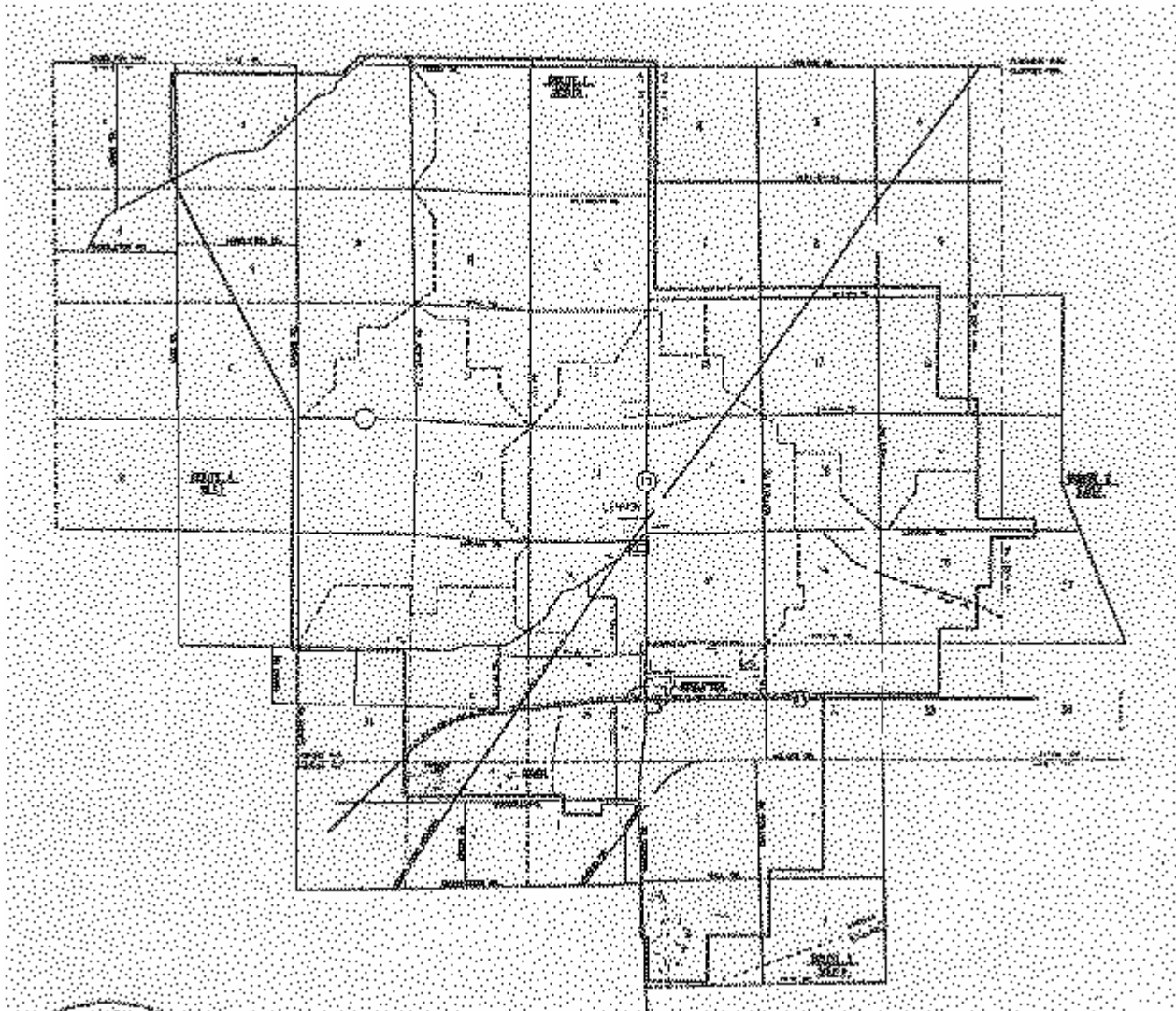

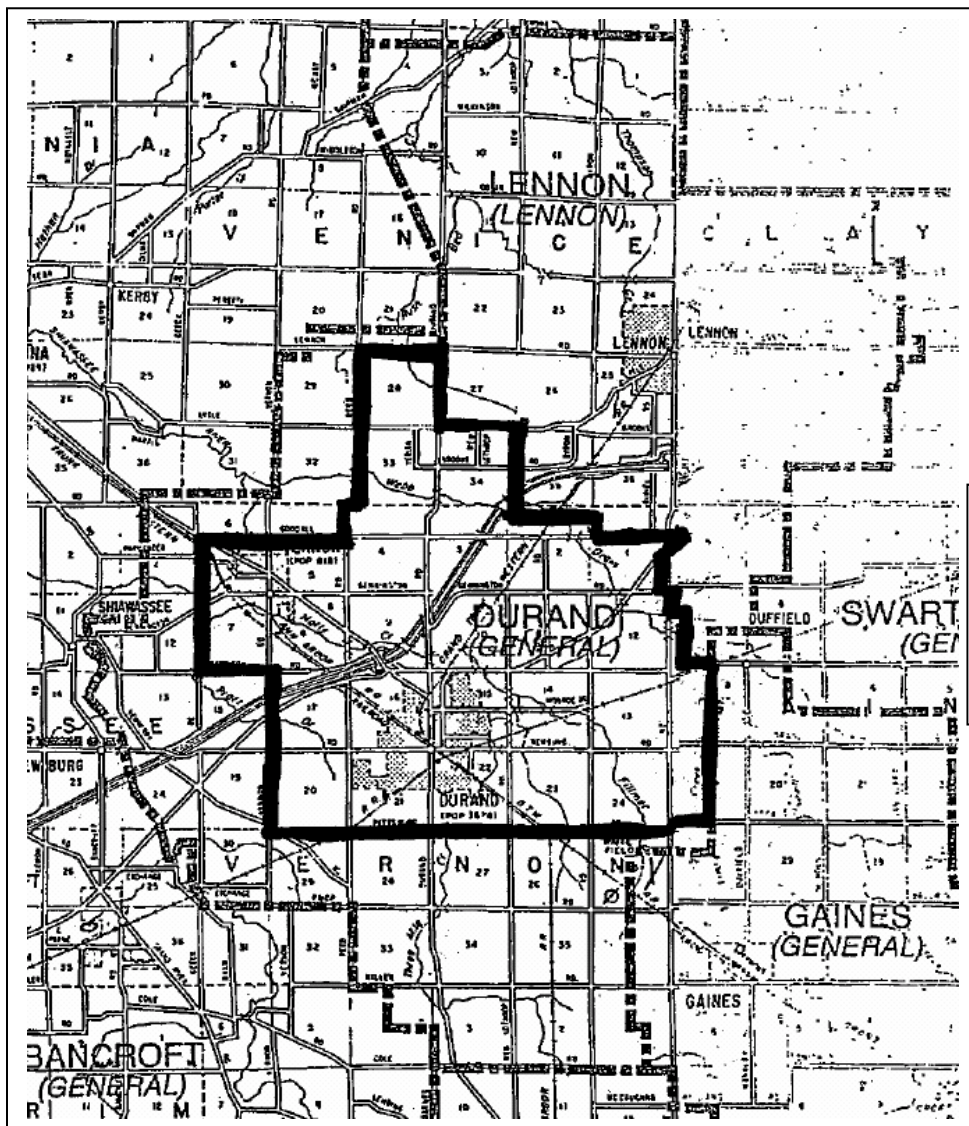

The Durand Area is comprised of the following geographic area:

Beginning at the corner of County Line Road and Pittsburg Road, West on Pittsburg Road to Vernon Road; North on Vernon Road to Garrison Road; West on Garrison Road to the Vernon Township line; North along the Vernon Township Line to Goodall Road; East on Goodall Road to Reed Road; North on Reed Road to Lennon Road; East along Lennon Road to the Western boundary of the Lennon exchange; then generally South and East along the existing boundary line of the Lennon exchange (as defined in Sheet No. 8) and continuing generally South and East along the existing boundary line of the Gaines exchange (as defined in tariffs of Verizon North, Inc.) and returning to the beginning point at the corner of County Line Road and Pittsburg Road.

APPLICATION OF BOUNDARY DESIGNATIONS

A. GENERAL

1. Application of Boundary Designations
 - a. Boundaries for Locality Rate Areas and the service areas for Exchanges are designated on maps in Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 1R.
 - b. Each establishment is within only one Exchange area except as provided in c. below.
 - c. Where the boundary is designated as a road (street or highway) the area includes that side of the highway on which are located the general plant facilities serving both sides of the highway. When such facilities are located on the near side of the highway, a customer located on the opposite side is considered to be within the area if he can be served by a drop wire using not more than one additional pole; when the general facilities are located on the far side of the boundary, a customer on that side is considered to be within the area if he can be served by means of a drop wire not requiring any additional poles.
 - d. Where the boundary is designated as the center of the road (street or highway), each side of the road is in a different service area.
 - e. Where the boundary is designated as a river (stream) or, railroad, each side of the river or railroad is in a different service area.
 - f. Where the boundary divides a lake, the shore of the lake is in 5 different service areas in accordance with the boundary designation at the shore line.
 - g. Where the boundary is designated as a Township section Line or a specified distance from a Township Section Line, customers are served in accordance with their location with respect to such boundary line. When such a line is other than the section line or one-quarter or one-half mile from a section line, the location of the boundary line with respect to the section line will be shown in feet or fractional miles on the Exchange Area Map Sheet.

SERVICE CHARGES

A. General

1. a. The Service Charges covered herein are applicable in connection with the establishment of Primary Basic Local Exchange Service and subsequent moves, changes and additions of lines, or other regulated services.

2. Service Charges

- a. The Service Ordering Charge is the charge for work performed by the Telephone Company in connection with the receiving, recording and processing of customer requests for service to be performed or provided at the same time, on the same system and on the same premises. The term "per order" means all work or service ordered at the same time for the same account.
- b. The Line Connection Charge applies to each central office line (exchange line, trunks, etc.) for work required in the central office and outside plant, including restoral of service after temporary disconnection of service for nonpayment.
- c. The Premises Visit Charges shall apply for those visits to the customer's premises by Company personnel which are necessary because of the customer's service request.

3. Customer Premises

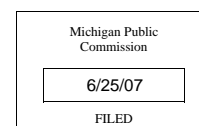
- a. A premises is a building, portion of a building or buildings on the same continuous property occupied by the customer in the conduct of his business or occupied by the customer as a residence. All space for offices occupied by a customer on the same or separate floors of one building are considered as a single (or same) premises.
- (1) Same continuous property shall mean an uninterrupted plot of land within the same block and occupied by one customer. Same block is defined as parcel of land enclosed but uncrossed by public thoroughfares. Railroad tracks, rivers and alleys are not considered as public thoroughfares.

A. GENERAL (Cont'd)

3. Customer Premises (Cont'd)

- (2) A building shall mean a structure on one foundation or two structures on separate foundations with a common wall or abutting walls with ready access from one structure to the other by means of doorways or permanent openings through the intervening wall or walls. Structures in the same or different block occupied by one customer and connected by passageways, shall be considered as the same building if the passageway is actually used as a continuation of the, space in the two buildings and not principally used as a walkway.

4. Additional Conditions

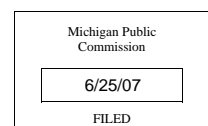
- a. Services charges are in addition to all other applicable rates and charges associated with the service being provided. Installation charges for additional equipment as shown in Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 2(R) may apply.
- b. The charges specified herein do not contemplate work being performed by the Company employees at a time when overtime wages apply due to the request of the customer nor do they contemplate work begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests overtime labor being performed or interrupts work once begun, a charge in addition to the specified charges will be made equal to the additional cost involved.
- c. No service charges apply for a change in service or move of equipment if made on the initiative of the Telephone Company for maintenance reasons or because of a change in the type of central office operation or for other Company reasons.
- d. No duplication of charges is made when, owing to the lack of standard equipment specified in a customer's order, installation of other standard equipment is made temporarily in order to provide service.

A. GENERAL (Continued)

4. Additional Conditions (Cont'd)

- e. No service charges apply for any changes in equipment required because of a change in class of basic service.

5. Restoral of Service

- a. Service discontinued by the Telephone Company because of non-payment when the services has not been disconnected is subject to the Restoral of Service Charge.
- b. When service is rendered inoperative by fire or other causes beyond the control of the customer which render the premises unfit for occupancy, the same service or type of equipment as destroyed will be reestablished at the same or different location, at the option of the customer, without Service or Installation Charge.

1. Service Ordering Charge

- a. Initial Service Order, per order

Applies to any new customer's service order \$14.00

- b. Subsequent Service order, per order

Applies to any present customer's order to relocate, install, change or add to the service; telephone number change; restoral of service after disconnect for nonpayment; additional central office lines, et cetera. \$5.00

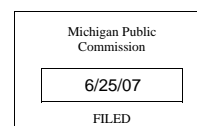

LIFELINE SERVICE

A. DESCRIPTION

1. Lifeline Service applies discounts to monthly recurring rates for qualifying residential customers. These discounts are applied to existing tariffed rates and charges for residential telephone service.
2. In order to be eligible for Lifeline service a residential customer's annual income must be at or below 150% of the poverty level as determined by the United States office of Management and Budget and as approved by the State Treasurer, or the customer must participate in one of the following federal assistance programs: (N)
 - a. Medicaid
 - b. Food stamps
 - c. Supplemental security income
 - d. Federal public housing assistance
 - e. Low-income home energy assistance program
 - f. National school lunch program's free lunch program
 - g. Temporary assistance for needy families (N)
3. Lifeline Service includes the services and functionalities enumerated in by the F.C.C. as follows: voice grade access to the public switched network; local usage; dual tone multi frequency signaling or its functional equivalent; single party service or its functional equivalent; access to operator services; access to interexchange service; access to directory assistance; and toll blocking for qualifying customers.
4. Other services can be provided with the Lifeline service at applicable rates and charges.

B. REGULATIONS

1. Regulations specified elsewhere in the Company's tariffs apply to Lifeline service.
2. Lifeline service is available only with residence services, excluding foreign exchange service. Lifeline service is limited to one line per household at the customer's primary residence.
3. A miscellaneous service charge does not apply when Lifeline service is added or discontinued to existing service when that is the only work being done.

B. REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

4. a. A discount of 20 %of the Basic Local Exchange rate or \$11.25, whichever is greater, on the monthly rate for residential exchange service for Lifeline customers is applicable. For Lifeline customers 65 years of age or more, the discount will be 25% of the Basic Local Exchange rate or \$12.35, whichever is greater. The total (C) discount shall not exceed 100-. of all end-user common line charges and the Basic Local Exchange rate.
- b. The credit will be applied in the following order: (1) The Interstate End User Access Charge, National Exchange Carriers Association, Inc., Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, Access Service. (2) End User Common Line Charge, Michigan Exchange Carriers Association (MECA), Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 25, Part XVII, Section 17.1.2. and (3) The balance of the credit, if any, will be applied as a credit to the basic residential service.
- c. The Company will provide, at the qualifying customer's option, toll blocking service at no charge. The Company defines toll blocking as a service provided by the Company that lets the customer elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls from their telecommunications channel.
- d. The Company will not require a service deposit in order to initiate Lifeline Service if the qualifying customer voluntarily elects toll blocking services.
- e. The Company will not disconnect Lifeline Service for non-payment of toll charges by qualifying customers.
5. The Lifeline plan will apply after receipt and processing of a completed Company or community/government provided application, including documentation indicating that the household income meets the eligibility standards established above.
6. Customers of Lifeline Service must notify the Company of any changes which would affect qualification. Reverification of eligibility will take place on an ongoing basis. When the customer is no longer eligible for Lifeline service, the Lifeline discount will be discontinued and regular tariff rates and charges would apply.

C. MONTHLY RATE FOR NON LIFELINE CUSTOMERS

A rate specified in MECA's Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 25, Part XVII, Section 17.1.2.1 applies per exchange access line to cover the costs of the Lifeline service, to the Telephone Company intrastate services as listed below:

- Business and Residence exchange services excluding Lifeline customers.
- PBX Trunk Services
- Centrex Services

The rate for business Centrex station lines will be computed based on the trunk Equivalence Table specified in the Company's Tariff M.P.S.C. No. 2R.

D. LINK UP PROGRAM

1. A discount on the line connection charge specified elsewhere in this tariff is also available to qualifying customers, for the installation or transfer of services from one residential premises to another.

 - a. In order to eligible for the Link Up Program, a residential customer must qualify for Lifeline Service. (C)
(C)
 - b. A qualifying customer may receive a reduction in the installation charges, or transfer of service charges, for connection at the customer's principal place of residence of half the customary charge or \$30.00, whichever is less.

- c. A qualifying customer may then make payments for the connection charges on a deferred schedule in which the qualifying customer does not pay interest. The interest charges not charged to the qualifying customer shall be for connection charges of up to \$200.00 that are deferred for a period not to exceed one year. Charges assessed for installation or transfer of service include any charges that the Company customarily assesses to connect subscribers to the network. These charges do not include any permissible security deposit requirements. (N)
- d. A qualifying customer may choose one or both of the programs set forth in 2.a. and 2.b. of this section.
- e. A qualifying customer can receive the benefits of the Link Up Program for a second and subsequent time only for a principal place of residence with an address different from the residence address at which the Link Up assistance was provided previously.

2. Eligibility qualifications, provider selection, etc. shall be determined in accordance with 47 CFR 54.601 *et. seq.*
3. Services to eligible health care providers at reduced rates will be offered in accordance with 47 CFR 54.601 *et. seq.*
4. Reduced rates to eligible health care providers are available only to the extent that adequate funding is available from the federal universal support fund.

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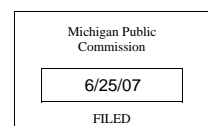
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GRANDFATHERED SERVICES

A. "Grandfathering" of Existing Service offerings No Longer Offered for New Installations

General

The following service offerings have been discontinued to new customers but continue for specific customers who were subscribing to them at the time of their discontinuance. These exceptions to regular , Tariff provisions are referred to as the "grandfathering" of the customers involved. The service offerings continued on this basis are identified below and are subject to the conditions specified in paragraph 2 below.

2. Service offerings and Rate Treatments

Grandfathered service offerings are continued only for existing customers at existing locations. The rates for grandfathered services are subject to change in the same manner and to the same extent as regular service offerings. No new or additional "grandfathered" services will be furnished. Where a new customer takes over existing telephone service, with or without a change in directory listing, where the customer initiates a change in class of service or where there is a break in the continuity, the "grandfathered" service is no longer available. The renting or leasing of the premises on which the service is provided to someone other than the existing customer voids the furnishing of the grandfathered service, whether or not the telephone service remains in the name of the original customer.

B. GRANDFATHERED SERVICES

Customers located in the northeastern portion of the Durand Exchange and customers located in the southern portion of the New Lothrop Exchange, receiving local service as a part of the U-11433 Lennon Exchange on or before June 5, 2000, shall continue to receive service and be charged for such services as part of the Lennon Exchange.
